All prices are quoted for seniors and/or Military when available and include Tax.

13 attractions marked with an astrisk should be a priority to see.

DAY TRIPS:

VISIT MT. RAINIER ON YOUR OWN: Trip takes 8 to 10 hours. Rental car plus gas is about \$100. You can purchase a "Golden Age Pass" at the park entrance for \$10. This will give you and all in your car free National Park admittance for the rest of your life. Total cost \$27.50 ea, for group of 4.

SIDE TRIPS:

<u>Sculpture Park</u>: Free. Included in 8 to 10 hours. A few miles short of the Park entrance on the right. Extremely unique and worth the stop, to say the least.

<u>Narada Falls</u>: Free. Included in 8 to 10 hours. It is worth the 15 minute walk down 75 feet to see. <u>Lodge and Visitors Center</u>: Free. Included in 8 to 10 hours. All new construction in 2009.

*Nature Trail: Free: Included in 8 to 10 hours. You will be getting there at the best time of the year for wild flowers.

Forest of the Patriarchs: This will increase your round trip drive by about 20 minutes and you should take an hour to make the 1½ mile hike through the grove. The drive over Cayuse Pass on the way home is much more beautiful than the drive back through Eatonville.

*N.W. Trek: Add two hours to your total trip and \$14.50 ea (\$12.50 military or AAA). This is worth seeing even if it entails a separate drive from Seattle.

Train ride out of Elbe: Add two hours to your trip and \$18 each.

GUIDED TOURS OF MT. RAINIER: You must make your own advance reservations.

Gray Line: 10 hours. \$95. Leaves from SeaTac Airport

Tours Northwest: 10 hours. \$109. Will pick up at Doubletree or Airport.

<u>Tailor-made tours</u>: 10 hours. \$105 Call Taylor-made Tours 2 weeks in advance for group tours of 10 or more.

TOUR SEATTLE ON YOUR OWN: Doubletree shuttle available to take you to the light rail terminal at SeaTac Airport.

<u>Light rail to down town Seattle</u>: Runs 5 AM to Midnight. Trip time - 40 minutes each way. \$.75 one way or \$1.50 RT all day.

SIDE TRIPS: All walking distance from light rail.

Monorail to the Seattle Center and Space Needle: \$2.00 Round Trip. Runs 8:30 AM to 11 PM. 1 mile in 2 minutes or half hour walk.

<u>Seattle Center</u>: Free. 1 to 8 hours. Includes Pacific Science Center, International Fountain, Children's Museum, Experience Music Project, International fountain, IMAX Theater, and almost continuous entertainment.

*Space Needle: \$16. Optional: Bruch - 10AM to 2:45PM - \$45. Lunch - 11AM to 2 PM from \$27.

*King Tut Exhibit: \$29.50. 1 to 4 hours. At the Seattle Center starting 24 May, the last time it can be viewed in North America.

*Pike Place Market: Free. 1 hour. Check out <u>Tours</u>. \$10 for groups of 10.

Seattle Waterfront: Free. 1-4 hours. Be sure see:

Olympic Sculpture Park. ½ to 2 hours. Free

Seattle Aquarium. ½ to 2 hours. \$19.95

Ye Old Curiosity Shop. A land mark since 1899. ½ to 2 hours. Free

<u>Ivar's Acres of Clams</u>. An historic landmark. Have a cup of chowder outside. \$3.49.

<u>WA State Ferries</u> from Anacortes – (The most scenic way to get there). 2 ½ hours to Anacortes, two hour crossing through San Juan Islands. \$47.50 each way for car, driver and one passenger. This is last year's schedule. Be sure to check the URL to see if it will be available in July 2012.

Kenmore Air: 1 hour, \$150 each way.

*Victoria Clipper: 3 hours one way. \$94. Foot ferry only.

Olympic Penninsula on your own: 450 miles but give yourself 3 days. See Port Townsend, Port Angeles, Hurricane Ridge, Ho Rain forest, La Push Indian reservation, Pacific Coast, and Lake Quinault.
